“ Jim would give you the shirt off his back if you needed it. Once he came home and told me what he had done, (he had a used car lot at the time); he saw a Mexican family with 5 kids, one just a small baby, walking along the interstate. He ask them what happened, man told him their car had broken down just north of where he picked all of them up and that they had no money and hadn't eaten for 2 days. He took them to McDonalds and bought a huge sack of sandwiches and fries. Said they were so hungry! After they ate he took them over to the car lot, he had an old car that he had taken as a trade-in, put better tires on it and filled it up with gas so they could keep going. He also gave the man all the cash he had on him and another sack of sandwiches and ask them to drop him a post card if they made it to their destination, but we never heard from them! The guys at Honda, where he worked before laughed at him, but he didn't care. He helped those guys out all the time, but if he asked anything of them they never showed up!

When we moved to Hawaii he started a nursery. He had never grown a poinsettia before, but grew and sold 27,000 of them to stores and they wanted more. When we had the farm market in Gordonville people would wait while he picked fresh grown okra. If we had watermelons and were closed, people would take them and leave the payment on the counter with a rock holding it down. Everything was in the open, but we never had any theft whatsoever!

I'm sad too Melody, but from what we talked about he was ready to go! Don't worry about him, cause I know he is in heaven! The disease he had was inherited and inherent! He and I had our ups and downs but he was the love of my life!
