



## George Pierce Hendrix, Jr.

March 23, 1923 - August 10, 2012

George P. Hendrix, 89, passed away at his home Friday, August 10, 2012, following a short illness. Funeral services will be held Monday at 11:00 a.m. at Thompson Funeral Home in Piedmont with the Rev. Philip Cooper, Rev. Ron McKay and Mr. Billy Lindsey officiating. Burial will follow at Highland Cemetery. The family will receive friends at the funeral home Sunday from 5-8 p.m. Survivors include his wife of 64 years, Marie Hodge Hendrix; a sister-in-law, Lavinia Hodge of Venice, Florida; and numerous cherished nieces and nephews. Pallbearers will be Brian Cheeks, Leroy Fitzpatrick, Sammy Holbrook, Rayford Ivey, Billy Lindsey, Greg Lyles, Brent Morrison and Charles Ray. Mr. Hendrix was a Cherokee County native and was a resident of Piedmont. He served in the United States Army Air Force during WWII and assisted with the organization of a national guard unit that was federally activated for service during the Korean conflict. He was employed by the Army Missile Command at Red Stone Arsenal where he was the recipient of various distinguished service awards. Mr. Hendrix maintained active membership in various veteran organizations, including "Retired Eagles". He was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Piedmont and served as the mayor of the City of Piedmont from 1996 - 2000. He was preceded in death by his parents, George Pierce Hendrix, Sr. and Myrtie Hendrix.
