It is with a heavy heart that we announce the passing of Michael Steven Lusk, age 72. Mike passed unexpectedly at his home in the Hollingsworth Community. He is known for his love of Alabama football, his dog, Louie, his wit and sense of humor, and his devotion to his two sons. Mike was born to the late Willie and Raymond Lusk on March 20, 1952, in Jacksonville, Alabama. He was the youngest of four children. Michael received his Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Alabama. After he served in the United States Navy, Michael decided to become a prosecutor. He received his juris doctorate from Loyola University in New Orleans, Louisiana. He began his legal career as a state prosecutor from 1983 to 1989. “ Mike came to the DA's Office two years after I did. We were friends ever since. I remember when a prisoner ran from the upstairs courtroom when a plea was being taken. The judge told the prisoner the possible sentence range. He bolted from the courtroom and ran downstairs and out the front door through the broken glass. Mike was right behind him. Mike's suit got caught in the glass and tore the suit. A deputy and I followed outside. We saw the prisoner in his orange jumpsuit a block west on 11th Street. When he jumped in the ditch, the police cornered him at both ends Mike said it incensed him that his defendant would escape from the courtroom. We all laughed about it later. I have many fond memories of Mike during the years.
